Alaska Representative Chuck Kopp: Report

- Spotlight this year is on full PFD versus state services in an economy based on oil income that is suffering. POMV is now paying more to the treasury than oil. He's in favor of a balanced budget rather than to focus all on dividend. Prefers to have a reasonable divided that to pay out the largest one possible. Consider all impacts of cuts.
- Have tightened loopholes on various crime bills.
- Legislature has agreed on a \$1600 dividend. Governor will call them back in October to work on a \$3000 dividend.
- Bond issues. When bonds are voted, Chuck believes the contract is made, so that state and property owners know what they will pay. He'd like that to remain as contracted.

<u>Anchorage Assembly Suzanne LaFrance</u>: Joshua Spring reporting. Willing to come to meetings early for one-on-one discussions

She voted against on-site consumption of marijuana due to difficulty to prosecute. Suzanne is not in favor of homeless sites having access to flammable devices in public areas.

ASD School Board Starr Marsett – will be at September meeting.
