DETAILS ON THE STORMWATER UTILITY. THE
ADDED UTILITY IS MOVING FORWARD. THE PRESENT
PERMIT ALLOWS DISCHARGE INTO COOK INLET.
THE PLANT (STORM DRAINS ETC) ARE OLD AND
WEARING OUT. THE ADMINISTRATION DOES
NOT HAVE A COORDINATING GROUP BUT HAS
ADDRESSED THE STORMWATER ISSUE.

PRESENTATIONS (CONT'D)

THE FUNDING REQUIRED MAY BE \$10-12 MILLION/YR TO REDO ALL PLANT TO ACCEPTABLE UPGRADES MAY COST \$1 B.

IN AUGUST 9 OF 11 ASSEMBLY MEMBERS VOTED FOR STORM WATER UTILITY AND MOVING FORWARD. ASSEMBLY APPROVED A STUDY TO REVIEW THE COST TO THE LANDOWNER. BILLING WOULD BE DONE BY PROPERTY SIZING.

JOHN PRESENTED FOUR SCENARIOS - ASSEMBLY

- ① PROVIDE UP TO \$1.5 MILLION TO CREATE ANOTHER UTILITY
- ② ORDINANCE TO PRESCRIBE RULES AND PROCEDURES FOR OPERATION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE UTILITY TO GUIDE PLANNING, DEVELOPMENT & IMPLEMENTATION OF THE UTILITY
- ③ ORDINANCE TO INSURE PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE STORMWATER UTILITY
- ④ RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A RATE STUDY TO DETERMINE THE IMPACT TO LANDOWNERS. THIS IS IMPORTANT SINCE ONE AREA MAY BE FUNDING SERVICES IN OTHER AREAS - ENTIRE RATE STRUCTURE IS OF CONCERN.
