### **Bragaw Street Project**

The Municipality of Anchorage (MOA) is planning on rehabilitating the pavement of Bragaw Street from the Glenn Highway to DeBarr Road. The primary objective of this project is to develop a plan to extend the service life of Bragaw Street. Surface rutting and deterioration are approaching the point where continued maintenance is unable to cost-effectively maintain the asphalt driving surface. Work will also include American with Disabilities Act (ADA) upgrades and may include minor roadway, drainage, and sidewalk reconstruction. The construction work is scheduled for the summer of 2004.
