Rehabilitation Project 2003

For the past two summers, ANHS has rehabbed homes in the Mountain View Community with the Neighborhoods Week program. One Block at a Time, World Changers and the Renaissance Zone Rehabilitation Program. This year, we are focusing our efforts in Mountain View in conjunction with the Arts & Cultural District Project. We will be working with property owners along North Bragaw street in the heart of the Mountain View neighborhood the week of July 7th.

We are also planning to improve several businesses along Mt. View Dr. where it intersects with Bragaw St. Similar to past years, we will be replacing roofs and fences, painting homes and landscaping yards. The project will be funded by a variety of sources, including Neighborhood Reinvestment, State Farm, Key Bank, and other community sponsors. Local organizations will participate through supply donations; World Changes youth, community groups and individuals will supply the volunteer labor.

There will be a neighborhood celebration tentatively scheduled for Thursday, July 10th.
