Sponsor(s) Needed

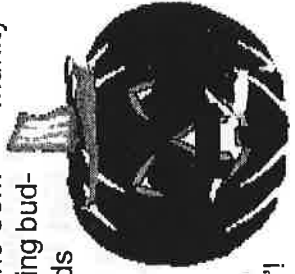
