# Open letter to members of "Mountain View in Motion"

Now that the Museum has had its doors open for a few weeks, I thought I should take time to let all involved in "Mountain View in Motion" know the impact we're having on our community.

I'd like to give you statistics, but there has simply been no time to assemble them, and a bit early for that yet. However, based on three weeks of guests visiting the museum, our slow days see about half dozen people, the majority being local residents. Busier days go into 35-40. Visitors are staying from  $\Omega$  hour to two hours, are actively reading rather lengthy text and are taking time to ask questions and seek answers for their kids. We are receiving families, individuals and the occasional group of kids such as the cub scouts we had yesterday.

Now all this doesn't sound impressive on the face of it, but considering this is a museum essentially starting from scratch with a minimal budget, a growing volunteer base, and little advertising in, for us, uncharted economic and social territory for Anchorage, the numbers are not only encouraging, they surpass my expectations and mental projections. I truly expected the Museum to be met with more trepidation and caution from the community, and I am thrilled beyond measure they are proving me wrong on a daily basis.

We are seeing young couples bringing in their children at least once a week; kids bringing in their friends, bragging to their peers of how much change they have personally seen take place; local craftspersons bringing in their wares to the gift shop; volunteers signing up; and many, many comments of happiness and gratitude that Mountain View is indeed in motion at last.

They are taking ownership one family at a time, block by block. They deeply appreciate that we are there in bluejeans working as hard as they do to make things work, and that we are willing to listen to their stories, their concerns and their children. They feel that we are there for them, not as a handout but as a leg up.

In closing, I bid you all to keep heart through thick and thin, triumphs and setbacks. If the Museum can be used as a gauge at this point, we are in the right place at the right time with the right purpose for the best, most appreciative people.

#### Mountain View In Motion/ Mountain View Arts and Cultural District Steering Committee Meeting — Notes May 12, 2004

#### Funding Updates

Rasmuson Foundation / Anchorage Community Land Trust: The Rasmuson Foundation has allocated \$5 million to fund the Mountain View project. The funds are currently tied up in the Community Land Trust. The Land Trust, which is on the verge of hiring a person to head the Trust, currently owns the Wilhour and Warner properties. These were recently purchased from Anchorage Neighborhood Housing Services.

Anchorage Neighborhood Housing Services and the Community Land Trust will be jointly funding additional planning for Mountain View by nationally known neighborhood revitalization consultants Charles Buki and David Boehlke. Both have become familiar with the Mountain View neighborhood.

Mountain View Satellite Office: The satellite office in the Success by Six building to be shared by Anchorage Neighborhood Housing Services, Cook Inlet Housing Authority, Habitat for Humanity, and the Anchorage Community Land Trust is open. The purpose of the office is to offer a central location within Mountain View where residents can go to access services offered by the agencies, and also to act as a central clearing house for information of interest to residents and businesses in the area. The office will be staffed full time during the summer months.

Mountain View in Motion Website: Susan Fison announced that a website "address" has been purchased for the Mountain View in Motion project: <a href="https://www.mvim.org">www.mvim.org</a>. The site is not yet operational, but will be developed over the next several weeks, and information will be sent to the Steering Committee when it is functional.

<u>Sadler Building</u>: Plans continue in the process of transforming the building into office space.
