Title 21 revisions should take into account the fact that the Birchwood/Chugiak/Peters Creek are communities distinct in-themselves from

Anchorage, with unique attributes and characteristics. The lifestyle enjoyed by residents of this area is notably different than that enjoyed by

the residents of Anchorage and Eagle River. Among other things, the Birchwood/Chugiak/Peters Creek area is more rural and the residents of that

area wish to maintain that character. This area, because it has retained

its rural attributes for so long, has a unique history that still remains an

integral part of our community's character and we should be allowed to retain this without having the same rules and regulations applied to our

area as are applied to the urban and suburban areas of Anchorage and Eagle

River. Notably, the acreage requirements applied to animals and livestock

(e.g., dogs and horses) for Anchorage should not be the same as those for $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) =\left(1\right)$

Birchwood/Chugiak/Peters Creek. Mushing and equestrian sports are central

to the character of our community and it would be wrong to destroy a large

part of what is at the heart of a vibrant community.
