A. Anchorage Park Foundation Challenge Grants

A workshop will be held on February 12 at 6:00pm at the Selkregg Chalet. Assistance with scope of work and budget preparation will be available at the meeting. The proposals are due on Friday, March 21. A letter of support from the Community Council is required. Other letters of support from the community may be submitted but are not required.

B. Neighborhood Watch – Anchorage Police Department

C. West/Romig Redesign
