    - Heather Ireland will summarize the results, and propose a Resolution further to a top priority emphasized by our surveyed members: i.e., that the RPCC supports undergrounding utility line projects in Anchor Park, College Village, Rogers Park, and Woodside East.

Be it resolved that the Rogers Park Community Council does not support the continuation of Moose's Tooth outdoor concerts at their current location, 3300 Old Seward Highway, and

encourages Moose's Tooth to consider other venues such as the Bear Tooth.
