Film Tax Credit Extension

I introduced [Senate Bill 23](#) this year to extend the Film Production Tax Incentive Program I fought hard to get passed in 2008. This bill would extend the successful credits for ten years, so the private sector can have confidence in the incentives and invest in a sound stage and workforce training programs. This past weekend, I met with four producers who are interested in producing a new big budget movie in Alaska because of Alaska's film incentives ([see ADN article here](#)), and they are very interested in supporting the local Alaskan economy. This bill passed out of the Senate Labor and Commerce committee last week and is now headed to Senate Finance.

Public Transit Funding



[Senate Bill 77](#) would provide \$3 million in state matching funding for public transit projects. Letters of support from municipalities around the state show what a huge impact this bill would make on local public transit. The bill passed out of the Senate Transportation Committee last week and is now headed to Senate Finance.

Funding for School Meals


I am a co-sponsor of [Senate Bill 3](#), led by [Senator Bill Wielechowski](#) (D-Anchorage). This bill would appropriate state funds to match an existing Federal program to help provide free and reduced school breakfasts and lunches to underprivileged children. This bill will help encourage school districts around the state to offer meals to students to ensure that they can concentrate on learning rather than their next meal. This bill passed out of the Senate today unanimously and is now headed to the House.

Alaska Performance Scholarship

[Senate Bill 43](#) is the Governor's proposed Alaska Performance Scholarship bill, which would increase funding for both performance and merit based scholarships to students entering college. I believe the Senate Education Committee has made good amendments to the bill, including establishing a sustainable funding mechanism. This bill passed out of the Senate Education Committee and is now headed to Senate Finance.

24TH ANNUAL KEY CAMPAIGN

I had the privilege of being the Keynote Speaker at this year's 24th Annual Key Campaign Unity Dinner last week. This has consistently been one of the most moving events during the legislative session, and I am always struck by the determination of the folks who come to Juneau to meet with legislators.
