Whereas, the Anchorage Municipal Charter Article VIII grants unto a duly recognized Community Council the basic right of self determination, and

Whereas, the Spenard Community Council being a duly organized community council under section 2.40.010 of the Anchorage Municipal Code, and

Whereas, the Spenard Community Council was formed in 1975 and has met regularly, and

Whereas, the Spenard Community Council has been consistently one of the most active community councils, and

Whereas, within the Spenard Community Council boundaries there are currently sixty eight licenses to sell alcoholic beverages; including beverage dispensary, restaurant/eating place, package store, clubs and recreation site licenses, and

Whereas, the Spenard Community Council has long been critical of liquor licenses (Beverage Dispensary or Package Store) locating in the Spenard area of Anchorage, and

Whereas, In-N-Out Liquor located at 3601 Arctic Blvd, Anchorage, AK 99503 is a local magnet for publicly intoxicated people, and

Whereas, In-N-Out Liquor located at 3601 Arctic Blvd, Anchorage, AK 99503 sell products that lend themselves to producing inebriation at a low price, and

Whereas, In-N-Out Liquor located at 3601 Arctic Blvd, Anchorage, AK 99503 sell many products whose containers are found in the vicinity of the liquor store and especially at Springer Park at 38th and Arctic Blvd, and

Whereas, In-N-Out Liquor located at 3601 Arctic Blvd, Anchorage, AK 99503 sells many products used by people frequenting said park and the park has become unsightly and requires frequent expensive cleanup, and

Whereas, In-N-Out Liquor located at 3601 Arctic Blvd, Anchorage, AK 99503 sells products used by people at Spring Park to the extent that Springer Park has become unsafe for other uses,

Be It Therefore Resolved, that the Spenard Community Council has voted to ask for the conditional use permits for In-N-Out Liquors Store to be reconsidered by the Anchorage Assembly to have the following conditions placed on their conditional use permits.

1. There will be no two ounce (commonly known as shooters) bottles of liquor sold.
2. There will be no hard liquor sold with a per fifth of a gallon price of less than \$20.00. A proportional price for any other size bottle will apply.
3. No beer will be sold in containers of more than 16 ounces.
4. The hours of operation will not be before noon on any day or extend beyond 10:00 p.m.
5. All persons working in the establishment will be Tamms certified.
6. All persons entering the premises will be asked to show their identification and any person who is not 21 years old or any person whose ID shows he/she is barred from purchasing alcohol will be asked to leave.
7. Video security of each person entering the premises utilizing door jamb cameras will be maintained for a 90 day period and an internet connection will be maintained so that the recordings can be reviewed by the Spenard Community Council and other law enforcement and Alcohol Beverage Control Board officials.
8. Serving an intoxicated person will result in a loss of the conditional use permit for this facility

Whereas, In and Out Liquor located at 1100 W. Benson Blvd, Anchorage, AK 99503 sell many products whose containers are found in the vicinity of the liquor store and especially at Benny Benson Park at Benson Blvd and Spenard Road, and

Whereas, In and Out Liquor located at 1100 W. Benson Blvd, Anchorage, AK 99503 sells many products used by people crossing Benson Blvd illegally between Spenard Road and Arctic Blvd causing vehicle wrecks and traffic hazards, and

Whereas, In and Out Liquor located at 1100 Benson Blvd, Anchorage, AK 99503 sells products used by people who use the sanitary facilities at the State DMV offices causing discomfort to the workers and patrons at said organization, and

Whereas, In and Out Liquor located at 1100 Benson Blvd, Anchorage, AK 99503 has patrons who linger in the area especially around Blaine's Art Supply causing problems for patrons and staff to include indecent exposure incidents that have been documented by the anchorage Police department

Be It Therefore Resolved, that the Spenard Community Council has voted to ask for the conditional use permits for In and Out Liquors Store to be reconsidered by the Anchorage Assembly to have the following conditions placed on their conditional use permits.

1. There will be no two ounce (commonly known as shooters) bottles of liquor sold.
2. There will be no hard liquor sold with a per fifth of a gallon price of less than \$20.00. A proportional price for any other size bottle will apply.
3. No beer will be sold in containers of more than 16 ounces.
4. The hours of operation will not be before noon on any day or extend beyond 10:00 p.m.
5. All persons working in the establishment will be Tamms certified.
