

Old Seward Ocean View Community Council
Meeting notes 28 March 2018

Meeting called to order at 18:40 by President Steve Beardsley.

Agenda: Nancy B. move; Stan second;

Minutes: Move to approve: Nancy J move, Second: Stan

Treasurer: \$0.05 interest to \$1552.72 now.

Signs for OSOVCC: Lost one sandwich board. Down to two and they're in bad shape and need updated times. Can get for \$190 each and vinyl decals of \$70 each. Two new would be about \$580. For only one sign, about \$260. We'll look into sponsors and possible other ideas for 4 new units.

FCC: Watching Brown Jug working with Mountain View CC to possibly adjust for benefit of environment. City wants to prosecute domestic violence cases. Working with State on that. 4 April – Party to welcome Kikkan and other Olympians on closed E Street from 5 – 7 pm. Working on another fix to SB91. Cannot see record from other states at this point. School consolidation study: Recommend not closing school yet since population may grow. Considering “Diverging Diamond” design like at Muldoon at Dimond and at Huffman.

Assembly: John Weddleton and Suzanne LaFrance.

- 3-1-1 is new non-emergency contact number.
- Crime: Felony goes to state and not many prosecutors, so case is dropped. Creating a felony domestic violence that would stay with city.
- Taxis are on strike again. Idea of re-regulation or new study on taxi regulations is up in April.
- Railroad HJR83 – recommends to federal reps that a solution is made. Assembly made a resolution in support of that.
- Issue with bail schedules; not due only to SB91. The bail schedule does not allow any crime outside of Alaska to be considered for setting bail. Assembly and Legislature are planning to make changes.
- Looking for a charter change for Whittier Police to issue parking tickets in Girdwood.
- Passed ASD operating budget. \$246 M from local contribution from property taxes.
- Drag racing at C and 100th will be ending due to APD

Guests:

1. Justin Keene from CRW about Dailey Avenue lighting: CEA did LED replacements in OSOVCC area from a state grant. Dailey Avenue has no lighting, so the new project, near OceanView Elementary, will be lighted with LEDs. Typically on north side of road. Conduit will be under the road. Poles

will probably not arrive until fall & will be installed then. OSOVCC President will have contact number for contract manager in case of difficulties.

2. Tim Myland – Traffic calming for Muni: 343-8470. Various ways to get funding include bonds or via the state. There are stipulations for community council areas which are higher in the queue. Pedestrian, bicycle, vehicle, school walking path – all are considerations in decisions. If a study of a recommended area shows there is not enough speeding, that street can be re-evaluated three years later. 343-6363 is the pothole team number.
3. Maeve Nevins-Lavtar – Muni Parks and Rec. South Anchorage Sports Park. Up and coming is Hamilton Park. Inclusive Play is the concept of being open to play for all ages. Sign-up sheet at meeting for being on advisory committee, with meetings not commencing until probably June. About 3 to 5 meetings. NevinsLavtarMV@Muni.org is contact. South Anchorage Sports Park is still being constructed. Gates are opened at 6:00 am and closed at 10:00 pm. RC planes group are still working on their plans. Flying in that park is not legal. Flying at Storck Park is legal.

New Business: Dogs off leash at estuary from Campbell Creek. Ask that OSOVCC have a resolution input.
