 - Push back from some folks who have participated on the task force things we're working on.
 - Meeting with city people Th, F, M
 - Whenever I see Rasmusen get involved I worry about the community voice. Sometimes they take over process.
 - Which project?
 - In general the homelessness issue
 - Resist that, want to see a community based response
 - Met with Carrie, raising substantial funds, set up a small group that figures out how to distribute monies
 - \$9million
 - Making sure our voices are at the table
 - Project that Jonath is working on, focused on site out by South Central.

 - Possible tiny houses, and small houses
