Last month, the members present passed a resolution 15-1 against a middle school being built at the far corner of the gravel pits (closest to Sand Lake Road / Dimond) and they voted 15-1 for the middle school to be built in the AS&G pit.

A huge project going on with the old seafood plant. The council voted unanimously to approve the project and zoning with an exception on the zoning being -- in case the project fell through, that there could not be a business like a chemical/asphalt plant replacing the project to protect the people. The project will be behind the building and they are planning for an indoor facility like the one on Old Seward Highway that caters to golf... the air building... This project will be an indoor football/soccer/track facility!
