Legislative/Assembly/School Board Updates

~Loki T: Education funding was vetoed by Gov. Hope to override veto. Recommend everyone call in, share their input, and donate time at Fairview Elementary. Was excited to talk about bill that would transition us to start thinking about what is next after natural gas and oil; Introduced legislation for access to 12-month birth control. Bill up tomorrow about electronic backhaul to get materials out of rural community landfills and into recycling facilities. Bill to acknowledge March is brain injury awareness month. Alaska has the highest rate of brain injury in the nation. Also introducing extreme protective order. also known as red flag law. Right to rehabilitative services bill introduced. Important to have good parole officers and parole board. Lastly, waiting to see if extension on STIP will be approved by federal highway administration. On March 30 at 10 am at Fairview Rec. Center, will have meeting to discuss Seward/Glenn PEL alternatives and submit comments.

~Chris C: Ballots in mail. If not received by Tuesday, call number (in chat). Ballots due back April 2, at 8 pm. VOTE!

~Dora Wilson: School Board put forth amendment with hope that will have increase to save 71 teacher positions. Please vote Yes on prop 1. Sixth grade is moving to middle schools. School start changes happening next year. Academies of Anchorage: reading proficient by 3rd grade, improving maths, and college career and life readiness school: transforming high schools to have more pathways to learn more about an industry they are interested in. Increase internships; building industry and business partners to increase college credit while enrolled. Freshman academy will start next year; learn about pathways and what career options are available to students.

New Business

SJ: Moved to establish a bylaws committee. 2nd by Janel W. No opposition; motion carried.

Presidents Report

Allen: AARP opened nominations for grants. Put proposal in: "Fairview Neighborhood Senior Access Initiative." Clear sidewalks from shrubbery for better senior accessibility in summer and in winter, "SnowFighter's Initiative" to clear the sidewalks from snow. Won't know until May about grant funding.
